HealthCheck Program

 Health Check is the West Virginia name for the federally mandated pediatric Medicaid Program, Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT)

EPSDT

- Preventive health program for Medicaid eligible children
- Children Aged 0 through 20 who have a current
 Medicaid card are eligible for EPSDT services

EPSDT SERVICES

- Screening Services
- Health and Developmental history
- Unclothed physical exam
- Immunizations
- Laboratory tests

Health education including anticipatory guidance

EPSDT Services

- DIAGNOSTIC/TREATMENT SERVICES
- Dental Services
- Vision Services
- Hearing Services

SCREENING SERVICES

- COMPREHENSIVEW HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENTAL HISTORY
 - Initial Health History
 - Health History Updated Each Screen
- A COMPREHENSIVE UNCLOTHED PHYSICAL EXAM
 - Documented on age appropriate screening form

SCREENING SERVICES

APPROPRIATE IMMUNIZATIONS

- Vaccines for Children (VFC) vaccines are provided for individuals eligible for EPSDT
- Providers are reimbursed for vaccine administration

SCREENING SERVICES

- Laboratory Tests
 - Includes blood lead level screening and testing appropriate to age and/or risk level

SCREENING SERVICES

- HEALTH EDUCATION
 - Includes anticipatory guidance

DENTAL SERVICES

- Preventive
- Children receive a dental referral:
 - At age 2 years and over for preventive dental care

 For treatment of any dental disease or injury discovered during a HealthCheck exam

VISION SERVICES

- Vision Screening
- Children receive a referral to an ophthalmologist or optometrist
 - Vision of 20/40 or greater in one or both eyes
 - Unable to be tested
 - Eye Abnormality

HEARING SERVICES

- Diagnosis of hearing
- Treatment for defects in hearing including hearing aids

OTHER NECESSARY HEALTH CARE

- Includes diagnostic services
- Services to correct or ameliorate defects

 Services to treat physical and mental illnesses and conditions discovered by screening services

PERIODICITY SCHEDULE FOR HEALTH SCREENS

- Babies are seen often
 - o Birth
 - o 2 weeks
 - o 1 month
 - o 2 months
 - o 4 months
 - o 6 months
 - o 9 months

PERIODICITY SCHEDULE FOR HEALTHCHECK SCREENS

- Children aged 1-2 are seen less frequently:
 - 12 months: Age 1
 - o 15 months

- o 18 months
- 24 months: Age 2

PERIODICITY SCHEDULE FOR HEALTHCHECK SCREENS

- Your children aged 3-6 are seen every year:
 - Age 3
 - OAge 4
 - OAge 5
 - OAge 6
 - o Age 8

PERIODICITY SCHEDULE FOR HEALTHCHECK SCREENS

- Children aged 10-20 are seen once each year
- No HealthCheck screens are provided after an EPSDT member reaches his or her 21st birthday

HEALTHCHECK & FOSTER CARE

- DHHR wants to ensure that all children placed in Foster Care are in optimal health
- DHHR requires that all children receive an exam, in accordance with HealthCheck protocol, at the time of Foster Care placement.

POLICY CHANGE

 In accordance with the WV Bureau for Children and Families Foster Care Policy Section 13, a well child exam, following the HealthCheck protocol, should be completed within 72 hours after placement into Foster Care.

PLACEMENT CHANGES

- The Foster Care Policy-Section 13 does not require and EPSDT/HealthCheck exam be completed if a child moves from one placement to another.
- For the safety and well being of the child, the HealthCheck Program strongly recommends that an exam, following HealthCheck protocol, be completed within 72 hours of a placement change.

PERIODICITY

- The HealthCheck Program has adopted the National AAP Preventive Pediatric Health Care periodicity schedule for well child visits.
- Additional HealthCheck exams outside the periodicity schedule for placement changes are Medicaid approved.

HEALTHCHECK LIAISON

- The HealthCheck Liaison for Foster Children is a DHHR/OMCFH employee and is HIPPA approved.
- The DHHR worker and the foster parent/agency may provide information concerning foster children with the HealthCheck Liaison.

LIAISON DUTIES

- Contacts the Foster parents/agency to determine a physician preference.
- Contacts the HealthCheck physician of choice and requests a HealthCheck appointment be made within 72 hours of placement.

LIAISON DUTIES

 If the HealthCheck appointment is missed, the HealthCheck liaison will notify the DHHR worker and/or the foster parent/agency and request that the appointment be rescheduled. Enters all data/information in the FACTS HealthCheck screen.
